#### DATES FOR YOUR DIARIES

**2nd - 4th February 2012** – "Glass Ceiling" is being developed by a group of our younger members, taking their cue from this year's riots. This promises to be a fascinating and moving comment on contemporary life.

**22nd - 24th March** – "My Mother Said" by Charlotte Keatley. Said to be the most performed play in the English language written by a woman playwright. The players first gave it in the 1990s, and we think it's due a revival. An engaging reflection on the lives of four generations of women in a family, the times in which they lived and the way that social change influences their lives. Great drama.

**10th - 12th May** – "Mr NcNamara Presents" – advices follow, but it will be excellent entertainment in his usual impeccable style.

**12th - 14th July** – "The New M.P.". Michael Branwell is writing a political "who's doing it" (as opposed to a "who done it"!). Known internationally for his excellent and workable translations and adaptations including last season's "Booty", Michael is turning his talents to a wholly original full length play. Like "Glass Ceiling" it takes its inspiration from recent political events.
