About the play and the author

The Booty is an important play, insofar as it shows the actual effect of terrorism, both governmental and anti-governmental, on women and families, about which we have read and seen a great deal, especially during the recent “Arab Spring”. However, the play was written some fifteen years ago and acquired from the author, Hamida Ait El Hadj, at the time living in exile in Paris, as disjointed manuscripts and badly typed odd pages. I am grateful to Djemal-Eddine Kechacha for translating the pieces originally in Arabic and Berber into French, which I translated and adapted to produce this play. During the original translation, Hamida came to England as our guest and approved the version played here in Harlow (at Victoria Hall), in Australia and at the Almeida Theatre in London. Much of the writing, which so accurately mirrors the recent utterances of some dictators in the Megrib (the “Arab West”), predates their speeches by about fifteen years. It was horribly prophetic then and is chillingly contemporary now. The script really has not been copied from current news reports!

Hamida Ait El Hadj graduated from the University of Paris and also studied at the Higher Institute of Theatre and Film in Kiev in the years before 1995. She returned to Algeria to teach and write, but, immediately following the first and only performances of *The Booty* in Algeria, she was forced into exile in Paris. She has now been able to return to her native Algeria, where she is currently teaching in l’Institut National d’Art Dramatique de Bordj El Kiffan. Her most recent play, *The River*, like *The Booty*, features a deaf mute who is able only to talk to the audience!

Every incident in the play is based on fact: the mass shootings of civilians, Ghanima’s ordeal, the New Family Code and Frankie’s protective measures all tally with reports from North Africa and the Middle East. Only (sadly) NATV - and its deliberately annoying jingle - remains as a pure invention of the translator! However, in 1999, it was Hamida who suggested the use of an interviewer to explain the evils of the State and its Family Code to those, like us, who had never experienced them.
